DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Time is 3 - 3.38 pm on Monday the 6th of September. Detective Inspector John O'Connor from the Source Unit calling Witness F on mobile phone, Nicola Gobbo.

WITNESS F: Hello.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Nicola, John O'Connor.

WITNESS F: Oh, my God, how are you going?

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Good. Yourself?

WITNESS F: Pretty shit, actually.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Oh, I'm sorry to hear that - - -

WITNESS F: Oh, look, I'm looking forward to - to Thursday and to hopefully ..... my holes - so that I can walk again.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right, well, all the best with that. Nicola, I just want to clear up a - a thing in relation to the [REDACTED]

WITNESS F: I know, you were wrongly advised as usual.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: It was an internal

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misunderstanding. So if you want to engage with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I can facilitate that for you.

WITNESS F: Mm.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I don't know the intricacies of

[REDACTED] but I can organise if you need to -

if you wish to meet with [REDACTED] or speak to

them, I can organise that so - - -

WITNESS F: Why phone - why can't I just pick the phone up and

ring [A 4th PO] myself.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Because we - well, my

understanding is that your - you wish to have a contact

with Victoria Police and that contact is myself.

WITNESS F: Oh, look, I'm .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I'm only - I'm only going -

Nicola, I - - -

WITNESS F: ..... it's not your fault - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: No.

WITNESS F: - - - you were wrongly informed and .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah, I'm only going on the

instructions been provided to me by my superiors - - -

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WITNESS F: Yeah, I know, I know, that's why I said I'm not going to have a go at you 'cause you - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: No.

WITNESS F: Frankly, you're just the poor bloke who's inherited the pile of shit which is me and, like, it's really unfortunate because God forbid if something should happen - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: So - - -

WITNESS F: - - - you'll be the first point of call, which is most unfortunate - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep so - - -

WITNESS F: - - - for you more than anyone else but - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: In - in one of your conversations that you've left on the - - -

WITNESS F: Yeah.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: - - - answering - answering machine you said that you wished to speak to [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] Do you want to do that or not?

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WITNESS F: I do want to but the - but what I've been told is, well, sorry, first of all, John, the - I have terminated my solicitor's instructions in relation to all of this because - and I - I mean I don't care, I assume you're recording this so I'll just say how it is. But if <sup>Sandy</sup>White 's told you anything about me, I'll just tell you how it is. Those retarded idiots that act for - act for Victoria Police do nothing but waste my time and money by writing idiotic letters. So there's no more solicitor's letters because every time they send something, which just repeats the same garbage that they've been spewing out for 12 moths, it costs me a fortune to reply to it. So there's no more of that any more.

If they've got something to say that's new or that takes into my account my [REDACTED] I'm all for it. Having said that, the reason why I've said to you, "Well, yeah, I do wanna pursue some form [REDACTED]" is because I - I - I have been labelled an informer in an open courtroom and I don't know where the attack may or may not come from. But what I've - what I always said to Shane O'Connell was, "I'm not the police and I'm not in a - I may not accept what you say, but I'm not in a position to argue with it." So you guys say, "A risk assessment has been done and you're in the highest category of danger, blah blah." I can't argue with that.

But at the moment, I can't run if someone was trying to shoot me because I can't walk. I can't drive a car legally or, I mean, I physically can, but I'm not insured

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to so I'm not supposed to be driving. And I've got surgery scheduled [REDACTED] Obviously I'm going to a hospital in [REDACTED] and I'll be there for four or five nights. I - I want to be able to move forward with [REDACTED] when I'm in a position to, but there seems to be no point in getting you stuck in the middle of it, even if it's just facilitating some form of contact or meetings or whatever. The position remains the same - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, that's, well, Nicola, that's - that's - - -

WITNESS F: - - - which is - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

WITNESS F: - - - which is Victoria Police saying, "You are in danger, in fact, you can't be in any greater danger than - than we say you are." Again, I don't argue with that. "But the only thing we're gunna do for you, is you can have the opportunity of [REDACTED] which will require you [REDACTED] [REDACTED]."

I'm being treated by an oncologist with cancer drugs. I've got four holes that are going to be debrided [REDACTED] with or without skin grafts. Without going into the whole saga, 'cause you probably don't know about the previous 10 operations I've had since [REDACTED] last year, but it will require a period of not walking,

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needing to be looked after, nursing care, blah blah, and

I can't - [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] "We're very sympathetic to the fact that you've got medical problems, but we [REDACTED] [REDACTED] them."

So it seems to me that it's just a pointless waste of time, yours more so than mine, because I don't have - I don't do anything every day 'cause I'm just stuck on a couch. But it's a waste of your time to arrange some meeting where they're just gonna say the same thing, which is, "Yes, you are a candidate. Yes, you're endangered. Yes, you should do this." And then I say to them, "Well, would it - would I be able to see my oncologist? Or would I be able to go and have surgery?" And they say, "[REDACTED] we [REDACTED] those things. Too bad, so sad." I don't want to - late yesterday I went to visit my father's grave, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] But I can't - I - I can't - I can't change my whole life and - and give it up if I can't have medical care, John. Simple as that.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah, well, Nicola, my - as I said before, I'm not - the way - the way it is - [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] - I don't know  
any - anything really about it so all - all my  
instructions are is that if you - I can facilitate  
contact if you want to do that. If you want me to do  
that, I will do it. If you want to wait until after your  
surgery, I can do that after that. It is - it is up to  
you. I'm just here as - as a conduit [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] But it's a decision, it's not  
my decision, it's a decision - - -

WITNESS F: No, no, no, listen, I get that and I understand - I  
really do understand that you are in a very difficult  
position, which is why I'm not gunna have a go at you.  
Because this - I don't know what unfortunate mishap  
occurred that you've ended up with the pile of shit which  
is me because you have and it - I mean, it's a terrible  
thing from your point of view. And I know it's your job  
and all the rest of it, but still a nightmare. If - I  
would be grateful if you could contact whoever it is at  
[REDACTED]

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah - - -

WITNESS F: - - - and ask them - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: It'll be - it'll be, yeah, I'll  
contact the - the boss [REDACTED] yep, and  
what would you - - -

WITNESS F: Yeah, and ask them - - -

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: What do you want?

WITNESS F: - - - whether or not their position has changed  
since I met A 4th PO

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: So whether or not their position  
has changed, all right.

WITNESS F: Yeah. And their position is, so - so you know, is,  
yes, [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] I'm not  
in the position where I'm in a certain level of danger  
this week or this month and - and next month or next week  
it might've changed. They're just saying it is what it  
is and it's permanent and it might fluctuate but it's  
never gunna be - it's never gunna go away. But what  
A 4th PO said to me was, fully understood, very sympathetic  
about the need for immediate and ongoing medical care,  
but when I said to him, "Well, [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] that?" He said, "I'll check." Then he came  
back and he said, "[REDACTED] there might be an  
interim measure," [REDACTED] He was  
then gunna get back to [REDACTED] in relation to an  
[REDACTED] to [REDACTED] and he never did.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right.

WITNESS F: And I'm - - -

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, I - - -

WITNESS F: - - - again - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah, well, what - well - - -

WITNESS F: - - - no criticism of him, it may be that - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

WITNESS F: He didn't because of the court case or because of  
God knows what.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right - - -

WITNESS F: But - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, Nicola, I don't - I don't  
- I - I appreciate that you've had conversations with  
them. I don't need to know any of that. All I need to  
do is I'll - I'll contact - I think the [REDACTED]  
protection is Superintendent Geoff Alway and I'll - - -

WITNESS F: Then don't worry about it. I don't wanna speak to  
him.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

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WITNESS F: He knows that. He won't speak to me, I won't speak to him.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right, I don't - I didn't - well, I've - I'm - I'll report - I'll speak to him, he - he may delegate it to another person, I don't know - is A 4th PO still at [REDACTED]

WITNESS F: Yes, he is.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: But - and then I'll - I'll get - get back to you. O.K.?

WITNESS F: That'd be terrific. I've got a meeting with A 4th PO in relation to someone else so I, you know, I've got his contact details. I do wanna have a - a meeting with them because, you know, I - I would be a fool if I didn't expect what I'm being told, what I've always been told. And, you know, I've been called an informer in an open courtroom repeatedly.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Right.

WITNESS F: There's a court case that's going on at this minute, obviously not in court right this minute, but I'm about to have the subpoena argument where I will feature significantly because I'm all over the surveillance logs from giving your office information last year and .....

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right. Well, I'll - I'll -  
I will - I will contact - will contact them and how long

[REDACTED]

WITNESS F: The surgeon said [REDACTED] if there's no skin grafts,  
[REDACTED] there's skin grafts, so I'm hoping just four,  
John.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right.

WITNESS F: .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, do you - if I - if I ring  
you this time next week with a reply, we can go from  
there?

WITNESS F: Beg your pardon, sorry?

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I'll ring - if I ring you next  
week, 'cause you're going into [REDACTED] or the  
[REDACTED] aren't you?

WITNESS F: No, no, [REDACTED]

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED]

WITNESS F: Monday.

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Monday. All right, well, I'll try and - I'll - I'll try and make some contact - or I will make some contact and then I'll be back to you this week. O.K.?

WITNESS F: So that would be good, yeah, I mean I - I - if you think that it would be a waste of your time to, like you said don't need to know the ins and outs of what has or hasn't been said before - the only reason I raise it, John, is because you saying any of it to them might save them time. But then again why should I consider about wasting their time .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: No, all I'll be - all I'll be doing - - -

WITNESS F: I get your point .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Nicola, all I'll be doing is passing on - - -

WITNESS F: - - - not to have to be involved in .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah, but all I'm here to do is pass on your request, O.K.?

WITNESS F: Yeah, well - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: And I - and I will do - - -

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WITNESS F: And my request is .....

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I will do that - - -

WITNESS F: - - - who wants unforced action, particularly in light of some things they have heard in the last week.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right, well, you - I'll get you - I'll speak to witness protection and then I'll be back to you. O.K.? But this - just in relation to - to saving toing and froing in relation to if there is to be a meeting - it would be fair to say at least a week to 10 days before you'd be in a position to be able to meet?

WITNESS F: Oh, no, no. Let's assume I'm   


DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep. So some time after that?

WITNESS F: I'll meet them - I'll meet them on Monday. I've got - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right.

WITNESS F: Other than - other than a multitude of doctors' appointments - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

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WITNESS F: - - - and focusing on my health and keeping safe,  
there's not a lot else I'm doing.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right. I'll - I'll be back  
to you in the next few days. All right?

WITNESS F: All right. And I think, look, I think having those  
stupid solicitors that keep - unfortunately they keep  
sending letters that say - and obviously you didn't even  
know that you were nominated as contact person, which was  
in their letter - they keep sending letters saying,  
"You're in danger, you should join [REDACTED]  
you need to for your own good, and, by the way, if you  
don't, then it's your problem." They are gravely  
mistaken, because you can't send a letter to someone  
saying, "We've told you to join [REDACTED] and if  
you don't, too bad if someone shoots you." The  
responsibility is always gonna be on Victoria Police so  
the solicitors - that's why I've cut 'em out, they just  
waste time and money. I, you know, in an ideal  
situation, John, I would like to be gone - I don't mean  
physically gone, as in dead - I mean, physically gone  
from all of the things that - that continue to pose a  
threat to me and continue to cause a problem for Victoria  
Police.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right.

WITNESS F: And - - -

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, I'll - - -

WITNESS F: I - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Nicola, I will - - -

WITNESS F: And in an ideal situation - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

WITNESS F: - - - health taken into account, if I could be living somewhere else, I'd be doing it tomorrow. Which would be better for Victoria Police and better for me.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Nicola, I will contact [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and I'll be back to you. O.K.?

WITNESS F: All right. Can you ask one other thing, John, and I don't know who to speak to about this. I have been told - I have to tell you this 'cause you're the contact and I have no-one else that I'm supposed to ring or can ring, for that matter. This [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] in April 2009 on [REDACTED] in one of the investigator's - investigator's [REDACTED]. I don't mean illegal, I mean a [REDACTED] And [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] that all of my doctors [REDACTED] pathologists, surgeons, oncologists, hospital, you name it.

Now, I've been told that for some reason best known to Victoria Police, they have chosen [REDACTED] the

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██████████ on Thursday, sorry, on Friday afternoon at 4 o'clock. I - given that it is - I understand it's the ██████████ that the ██████████ goes to, 'cause I've got all the paperwork ██████████. Is there some reason why I can't just take over ██████████ the ██████████, John?

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I'll ask ██████████ ██████████ and it's another - it's another area that I'm not an expert in so - - -

WITNESS F: Yeah, I know, and I'm sorry to bug you with it, but I mean, if you said to me, "Look, you've - here's this, you know, here's such-and-such, ring him," I'll do it. But it seems to me that you've just been apportioned - I shouldn't keep saying that I'm a pile of shit, but I mean, I am the biggest mess known to mankind and you've inherited it so - I don't know who to ring about it, but the arrangement last year was, "Here's ██████████, don't abuse it, but do not, you know, keep ██████████ on in case there are threats or contacts or whatever. But use ██████████ as ██████████ without including your surname." I've always abided by that, but unfortunately, you can imagine, after 18 months how many people have this ██████████ Not crooks, but doctors and so forth and I don't know how I'm supposed to go and ██████████ ██████████ get a ██████████, ring everybody and say, "This is a ██████████," and I won't have ██████████ after 4 o'clock on Friday either because they've - instead of allowing me to ██████████ and take over the

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[REDACTED], Victoria Police are going to [REDACTED]  
one and a half [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] for  
something that's [REDACTED] next year.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yeah, oh, look, again, Nicola,  
I'm not an expert in that. I will - I will - - -

WITNESS F: So, yes, oh, look, I'd be grateful if you could ask  
somebody somewhere if I can do that because I don't - I'm  
not gunna [REDACTED] after 4 o'clock on Friday. My  
[REDACTED] [REDACTED], which I assume you've [REDACTED] isn't with me  
and I don't [REDACTED]. I mean, I - this has been [REDACTED]  
and - and [REDACTED] that links - oh, I don't - look, I  
don't really care about - I mean [REDACTED],  
mostly it's medical people and I don't know why they'd  
wanna do this to me - just to be arseholes, I suppose.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: I will make an - I will make an  
inquiry and then I'll - I'll be back to you. I will ring  
- contact [REDACTED] to see if - what the and  
pass on what you wish, and then I'll be back to you.  
O.K.?

WITNESS F: That would be terrific and - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right, well you - - -

WITNESS F: John, one other thing, insofar as the provision of  
information I am not in the business of wasting your  
time, as you would know from the past, I hope, but is -

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is there any point me speaking to you about Carl Williams set up?

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: If - it's up to you, Nicola, you can speak to me or you can ring Crime Stoppers.

WITNESS F: Oh, listen, I'm not gunna ring Crime Stoppers and [REDACTED] You - you must be - I mean, that's as idiotic as them sending me a letter saying ring triple O. Why - the reason I'm asking is not - not from the value point of view for me, it's - there are things that I've become aware of that may or may not assist you. I don't care. If I don't say anything, so be it, so - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Well, if you - if you - - -

WITNESS F: If you want, all I'm saying is, if you want to listen to it all, I'm happy to tell you it, but if you don't, then I won't.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: No, I'm - I'm happy - I'm happy to listen to it, but just to let you know that any information you provide I may or may not act on. All right?

WITNESS F: Yeah, that's O.K., but that's always been the case.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

WITNESS F: It was always the case when I was speaking to

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whoever was my babysitter.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Mm.

WITNESS F: It's not up to me to determine the value or  
otherwise - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Yep.

WITNESS F: - - - of what I'm saying. It might be the piece of  
jigsaw puzzle that helps you or it might be something you  
already know. In my case, it was a case of I get told  
about somebody being responsible for someone's murder,  
you may as well know that I relieve my conscience.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right. If you want to share  
that information with me, that's fine.

WITNESS F: All right. Well, are you - if you're gunna speak  
to the powers that be about [REDACTED], I just  
don't see why I couldn't [REDACTED]. Are you likely to  
ring me back tomorrow, John, or - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: Oh, I'll be - I'm like - well,  
possibly, tomorrow, yeah. I dunno, I have to speak to  
the powers to be, first, so - - -

WITNESS F: O.K. Well - - -

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: But, Nicola, I just want to make

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it clear - - -

WITNESS F: Yes.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: You're not gunna - we're not gunna enter into a relationship that you previously had with this unit.

WITNESS F: I don't want to, John.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right. Just making sure you're well and truly aware.

WITNESS F: Listen, you don't need to say that, John.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: If you - yeah, but if you wanted - if it's like any public-minded citizen, and I'm not trying to be patronising here, Nicola - any public-minded citizen, if you choose to provide us with information then we'll assess it - may or may not act on it.

WITNESS F: I have no issue with that. Look, the reality is, I didn't - I wasn't motivated by greed or by my own need to get something from Victoria Police on the 15th of September 2005 when this stupid, idiotic path that I took began. But my motivation hasn't changed, my position hasn't changed and leave aside - forget about something new - if it's something new, I don't wanna know. But people still unfortunately - I still hear things, and obviously I've got an ear to the ground, John, about my

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own safety because, you know, having been declared an informer in an open courtroom, there's not a lot of way back from that. And there's not a lot - there's not a lot that you can actually do about it unless I'm living somewhere else and - and hidden away from most people, to the extent that I can.

But when it comes to something that - that your office has already put in motion and in - in this case, you know, where some successful operation has been run and 40 people got arrested, or a current thing where I have already provided information, it's not something new, and I don't want the relationship I had before - there's not a chance of that in the world happening so thank you for pointing it out, but it won't happen. But when it comes to clearing up things and finishing them, I'm all for that, and that's what I'm talking about.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right, well, I'll be back to you in the next few days.

WITNESS F: That would be good and I'm sorry I couldn't answer when you rang, but I won't have a conversation with you when there's someone else, for obvious reasons.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: All right. I'll be back to you in the next few days. O.K.?

WITNESS F: Thanks, John.

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DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: See ya.

WITNESS F: See ya.

DETECTIVE INSPECTOR O'CONNOR: The time is 3 minutes past 4.
