1. The prisoner is Peter Pilarinos. He was born on [REDACTED]
2. On Monday 2 July 2007, the prisoner attended Kevin Dennis Motors in Braybrook with another unknown person who went by the name of Peter.
3. The prisoner expressed interest in purchasing a 2006 Holden GTS Sedan [REDACTED]
4. The prisoner dealt with a salesman at the caryard, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and told him that his name was [REDACTED] <sup>P/I</sup>
5. The prisoner took the motor car for a test drive and then negotiated the purchase of the car with [REDACTED]
6. A purchase price of \$72,000 was negotiated and the prisoner told [REDACTED] that he required finance for the purchase. He paid a \$500 deposit for the car.
7. The prisoner then dealt with the finance manager at the caryard, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and completed the necessary paperwork to apply for finance for the purchase.
8. The prisoner made the application in the false name of [REDACTED] <sup>P/I</sup> and provided a false address of [REDACTED] Keysborough.

20. A brown and black coloured bum bag was located on the front passenger seat. Inside it were 2 resealable bags containing a moist yellow powder substance. Subsequent analysis identified this as a mixed substance containing 3,4-methylenedioxy-*N*-methamphetamine (MDMA), a drug of dependence.
21. The total quantity of the substance was 8.2 grams and the purity of the MDMA was approximately 6%.
22. A traffickable quantity of a substance including MDMA is 3.0 grams.
23. Also located in the bum-bag were a further six .32 calibre bullets wrapped in plastic and black duct tape, \$370 cash and cards in the prisoner's true name.
24. In the car the police found a photocopy of a driver's licence in the name of [REDACTED] and three mobile phones and three SIM cards. One of the SIM cards was for the number [REDACTED] the number the prisoner provided to the staff at Kevin Dennis Motors as his contact number.

#### Counts 4 -8

25. At about 5.30 a.m. on 19 July 2007 the prisoner was taken by the police to his home address at [REDACTED] South Yarra. They confirmed this as his address and at about 9 a.m. they executed a warrant to search.
26. Various items of drug paraphernalia were located including electronic scales, glass pipes, glass bottles and tubes.
27. Drugs were also located in the premises. They were
  - 27.1. One rectangular tablet in two parts, in a resealable bag. This was identified by a forensic scientist as Alprax or Zamhexal, containing 2 mg of Alprazolam per tablet (Count 4);
  - 27.2. One mottled white tablet in a small resealable plastic bag. Analysis by a forensic scientist revealed this to have a weight of .3 grams and it contained 3,4 methylenedioxyamphetamine (MDA) (Count 5);
  - 27.3. A glass vial labelled "...DECA 50 NANDROLONE DECANOATE..." containing a substance in the form of a yellow oily liquid. Analysis by a forensic scientist revealed the substance to have a weight of 3.4 grams and it contained Nandrolone Decanoate (Count 6);
  - 27.4. 10 yellow triangular tablets. Analysis by a forensic scientist revealed these to have a weight of 1.4 grams and contain oxymetholone (Count 7);
  - 27.5. 87 blue heart shaped tablets and 194 pink pentagonal tablets. Analysis by a forensic scientist revealed these to have a combine weight of 30.9 grams and contain methandienone (Count 8).
28. The prisoner was interviewed three times by police, the first time shortly after his arrest on 19 July 2007, in relation to the items found in his possession, the second after the search of his home on 19 July 2007 and later, on 3 August 2007 in relation to the finance application.
