States:-

- My full name is Mr Cooper I am years of age.
- I make this statement in the belief that the information I provide to the police cannot be used against me in any future court proceedings.
- He is a young boy which I think is in the age group of around 20 to 25 years. He seems to be a new nominated clean-skin that Milad has entrusted to do various tasks for him.
- 4. These kinds of people tend to pop up from time to time. No doubt he is not aware of the cunningness of the Mokbel clan and is doing a lot of dangerous work such as in running drugs around from place to place, with very little knowledge of dangers involved and very little earnings received for his duties. They know how to pick them.
- Brunswick on Anzac day the night of Milad and my arrest. I arrived at the address, parked in the driveway and walked to the front door. Milad greeted me at the front door. We proceeded to walk into the house and I walked towards the laundry as I normally do. On the way to the laundry I could see down the hallway into the back living area.

 I went into the laundry and negotiated with Milad about money. I left the present containing the drugs on the counter.

Mr Cooper

- He seemed to be ready to help Milad in the cutting process of the amphetamine I
 had delivered to the house on that evening. I said goodbye to him as I left.
- 7. To my knowledge he was arrested and questioned by police. I was later informed he was wearing gloves. I did not notice him wearing gloves as I entered the premises no doubt he put them on as Milad and I were saying our goodbyes at my vehicle in his driveway, moments before police arrived.

8.

That is all I know about him.

- I have made previous drugs deliveries to Milad before this. I would estimate that I have delivered drugs to Milad on at least fifteen separate occasions at least. They were all 10 kilograms amounts or more. On 90% of these occasions I have delivered these drugs to Milad's home of Brunswick.
- 10. When I did deliver drugs to Milads home often other people were present. This is why I would always deliver the drugs wrapped up as a gift, in a box wrapped in wrapping paper and with a bow. On one occasion when I did a cook at Preston, I delivered the drugs wrapped up as an easter egg basket, with the drugs wrapped disguise in cellophane paper with easter eggs on top and a big bow. Milad's family, Renate and his children, would have been present for about half of these deliveries. I would say hello but not discuss anything else with them. On occasions, other persons were also present but not involved in the transaction. I always did the transaction with just Milad in the laundry.

11.	In addition to this, I would also sell smaller amounts of drugs to Milad. This was
	normally extra amphetamine I had made during a cooking process. This was
	basically the surplus of 2 to 3 kilograms made from 10 litre ketone cooks. I
	would sell to Milad in pound lots and this normally occurred at 'The Grove'
	coffee shop.
